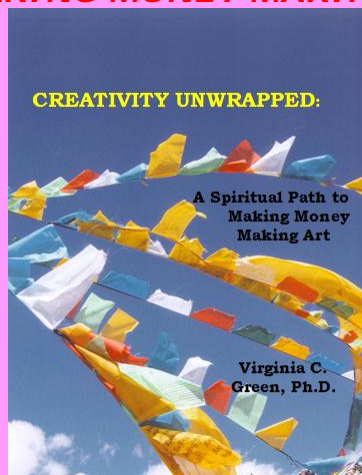

Are You **Building a Cathedral?**



I have just finished reading a great book by Ken Follett, *Pillars of the Earth*, which traces the fifty year process of building a cathedral in England in the 12th Century (Think *Lion in Winter* era). And, I was

thinking about you. As usual.

I love stories that remind me that things take time-- truly great things, and even not so great things. In the course of building this fictional cathedral, kings and queens come and go. earldoms are lost and regained. Villages and whole cities are destroyed and rebuilt. It takes alot longer to build a cathedral than to build a city.

Technology changes, too. Architecture grows as our understanding of geometric principles evolves, and suddenly (not suddenly really...nothing is "sudden" about a cathedral) we can build walls that soar, with huge gaps between pillars we can put glass in instead of rock, and wouldn't it be beautiful if that glass could come in many different colors and maybe even tell a story?

While cathedrals are slowly rising, children grow up to be grandparents. And the builders and monks and bishops who had the original vision for the cathedral come and go, too. Hundreds of people and their offspring touch the stone as they build something so durable that only bombs could destroy it in an afternoon...well, actually there are many things that threaten a cathedral, only some of them material. Some cathedrals are destroyed from the inside out.

Are you building a cathedral? Maybe you are building a chapel. That's okay. It's still a prayer. But there is something about a cathedral that is grand and humbling at the same time. Knowing that probably it

will not be finished in your life time. Knowing that many times you will be the only one who understands what you are proposing. Knowing that the change in governance of the realm may impact your finances. Knowing that for many years there will be scaffolding where there is supposed to be incense. Knowing that God is okay with that. In fact, perhaps our Creator is thrilled that you would have taken even the smallest step toward building a cathedral of our own. Have courage, intrepid builder. Sometimes it is enough to carve a piece of pillar. Sometimes you have to dig a quarry. One thing about a cathedral, it is never really finished, is it?
